LYNN M. PALTROW, J.D. is the founder and executive director of National Advocates for Pregnant Women. A graduate of Cornell University and New York University School of Law, she combines legal advocacy with grassroots and national organizing to secure the human rights, health, and welfare of all people, focusing especially on pregnant women and those most likely to be targeted for punishment - those who- low-income women, women of color, and drug-using women. Ms. Paltrow has served as a senior staff attorney at the ACLU's Reproductive Freedom Project, as Director of Special Litigation at the Center for Reproductive Law and Policy, and as Vice President for Public Affairs for Planned Parenthood of New York City. In addition to fellowships from NYU and Georgetown and an honorary degrees from John Jay College of Criminal Justice and the CUNY School of law Ms. Paltrow has been honored with the Gerald Le Dain Award for Achievement in the Field of Law and the Barbara Seaman Award for Activism in Women's Health. She was named one of "21 Women Leaders for the 21st Century" by Women's E-news. She is a Gemini and mother of twins.
